## GOING HOME

Sunday, July 29<sup>th</sup> is the end of Annual Session.

While this is a time for many goodbye's, it is also the time for us to leave campus. We need to be **out of the dorm rooms by 3:00 p.m. on Sunday** (sooner would be better).
